WOMEN AND POVERTY

ACCORDING TO THE GLOBAL POVERTY INFO BANK, WOMEN ARE 50% OF THE WORLD'S POPULATION, YET MAKE UP FULL 70% OF THE WORLD'S POOR.

It's an astonishing figure. Millions of women in less-developed countries live under crushing poverty and discrimination that makes access to basic needs such as healthcare, safe childbirth, education, employment, and participation in their own communities, nearly impossible. This means we must ensure women and girls have a means to overcome inequality and benefit from economic development by addressing the core problems head on.

WOMEN REINVEST MORE INCOME IN THEIR FAMILIES AND COMMUNITIES.

Providing women the means to run businesses is the path out of poverty for developing nations. Research shows economic growth for women has an extremely important effect. In fact, women reinvest as much as 90% of their income in their families and communities. According to USAID, one in five girls in developing countries who enroll in primary school never finish because when family resources for schooling become scarce, they are reserved for boys. However, women spend more of their earned income on food, healthcare, and education for themselves and their children, including girls. And when 10% more girls go to school, a country's GDP increases on average by 3%. If we give women the means to earn a living, they will invest it in their daughters as well, helping nations rise out of poverty, addressing the core problems head on.

SAVING YOUNG LIVES

HAND WASHING WITH SOAP AND WATER IS THE MOST COST-EFFECTIVE PREVENTATIVE ACTION FOR REDUCING THE OCCURRENCE OF BOTH PNEUMONIA AND DIARRHEA.

Today, pneumonia is the leading cause of death for children under five in developing nations. Pneumonia accounts for 1.2 million infant and child deaths annually and kills more children than AIDS, malaria, and tuberculosis combined, accounting for nearly 1 in 5 child deaths. Diarrhea continues to be a serious health issue, and is the second leading cause of death for children under five claiming 760,000 lives worldwide. (UNICEF.ORG)

The Lovin' Soap Project provides women with the skills and knowledge to make soap as a micro-business to support their families. As a result, women gain the ability to use excess soap from the process for hygiene. In addition, with their comprehension of how soaps are formulated, what types of ingredients are necessary, and the instruction provided by the Lovin' Soap Project on local sourcing, women are empowered to make their own, inexpensive yet effective soaps to help maintain basic health and sanitation.
